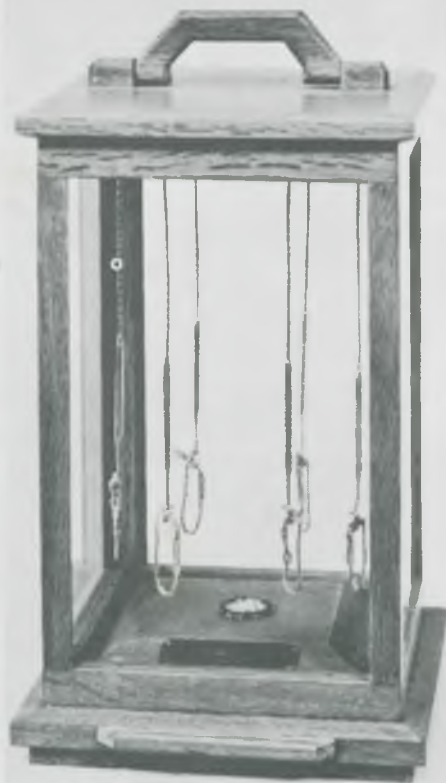

## SIX SILVER ROPES



This photograph is of six silver ropes which are being given in memory of the late Tom Price, Stroud branch secretary (Gloucester & Bristol DG) for 30 years, until 1965.

The silver ropes hang in a glass sided oak case and surround Tom's old-style lapel badge. The silver plaque bears the words: Tom Price, 1891-1970. 'This was my life, this was my giving'. *Laus deo*. A drawer in the base carries a photograph of Tom, with his model bell and dedicatory wording.

The ropes will be awarded annually to the winners of the Branch striking competition and thereby, it is hoped, help to raise the standards and interest in local ringing, in much the same way as the Croome Trophy has for the whole G & B.

Although no popular name has yet been attached to the ropes; be it that they become known perhaps as 'The silver ropes', 'the silver sallies' or some other name, the donor regards it more as a 'compliment for good striking' from Tom himself, rather than a plain 'Trophy'.

It is the design and gift of Mr. E. Cribble and will be presented to the winners by Mrs. T. Price at Stonehouse on July 9 at 6.30 p.m.

## HIS 25th ANNIVERSARY

THE VICAR of Haslingfield, Cambridge, the Rev. John B. Rowsell, who will be remembered by many of the ringers in the Farnham District, Guildford DG, in which area he learned to ring, rang his first peal for 25 years for the Jubilee at his own parish church of All Saints. The peal was rung by the Sunday service band. It was also the 25th anniversary of his ordination into the Ministry, and he received many congratulations.

## CHANNEL ISLANDS REJOICE

The Jubilee celebrations were a fitting occasion for historic events in Jersey. The local band had foreseen an opportunity to put to the test all the hard work and training since the first 120 Doubles were achieved a year ago and the rehanging of the bells in 1974. At 8.30 in the morning a band assembled to try for the first peal (Plain Bob Minor) in Jersey and all were members of the local Guild, three having been taught to ring on the St. Mark's bells. Jack Worrall, who came to the Island last year, with a well known ringing background, was the obvious choice as conductor for his 200th peal, and Charles Lovett, who rang his last peal (of Maximus!) over 40 years ago, made up the remainder with the tower master, John Gill, who learnt to handle in Banwell, Somerset. The ringing was of a good standard throughout and four firsts were achieved with "That's All!", together with a first for the Island of Jersey.

The previous Sunday saw the visit of six members to help St. Anne's, Alderney, in their festivities, and St. Mark's was also sufficiently well-manned to cope for the local Jubilee service. Low cloud did not deter the visiting band who, although their plane was late arriving, rang a quarter of P.B. Doubles after the service.

At Standon, Herts., on Jubilee Day, Mrs. M. Ribbons at the age of 76 rang her first quarter peal.

Mr. W. A. S. Infield, who has been a ringer for 45 years, rang his first quarter at Tempsford, Beds., on June 5, for the Jubilee.

In March of this year, Derek and Ruth Tysoe started to train a band from scratch at All Saints Elson, Notts. The local band rang for service for the first time on Jubilee day, June 7, for a special service, and without the help of their tutors. They are indebted to Mr. Percy Holmes for his help on that day.

We all had plenty of ringing for the Jubilee even if we were not successful. I for one shall remember the weekend if only for my sore hands, 21 Jubilee blisters!—P.R.B.

On Jubilee day Dawlish, Devon, ringers were pleased to welcome Mr. Wilfred Gay (aged 80) for ringing during the afternoon. Mr. Gay who resides in Teignmouth has rung for all Coronations and Jubilees at Dawlish since the death of King Edward VII in 1910. He was born on Queen Victoria's Diamond Jubilee day in 1897 and rang at Dawlish for the Coronation of George V in 1911, the Jubilee of George V in 1935, the Coronation of George VI in 1937, the Coronation of Elizabeth II in 1953.—D.J.H.

There was a special "single" start (12345678/21346578) for a peal of Yorkshire Surprise Major at All Saints, Leicester on Jubilee day. A composition by Alan Cattell (who rang 3 and 4 and conducted) brought the peal home at 5277 changes (52-77—the Accession and Silver Jubilee years).

Editorial:—

**SILVER JUBILEE BELLS**

This content of this special issue tells its own story: bellringers everywhere responded wholeheartedly and played a great part in the rejoicings and celebrations for 25 years' reign of Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II. In towns and villages, from cathedrals and parish churches up and down the country, the bells pealed out their joyous message of congratulation, loyalty and affection for a gracious lady, her husband and their family. Ringers in cathedrals and churches with rings of bells in Australia, New Zealand, Canada, Rhodesia, S. Africa and the United States joined with their British brethren in ringing peals and quarter peals.

Although there are so many reports in this week's issue, it is but a small part of the whole, for there are hundreds of towers which rang shorter touches, call-changes and rounds alternating with the Queen's change which will not be recorded. Nevertheless it sufficed and we know that the hearts of all rang out with the bells they were ringing for this celebration.

The large number of "firsts" is encouraging and exciting. A first quarter-peal; a first peal; first in the method, inside or as conductor—and local bands who rang something for the first time must feel proud of their efforts. Then there are those who "came out of retirement" to take their part and no doubt enjoyed the feeling of elation at the end of the ringing. A number of ringers remember the Coronation whilst the older ones perhaps rang for the Coronation of our Queen's father, King George VI. Fewer, no doubt, took part in the Silver Jubilee of King George V and Queen Mary back in 1935, whilst a few—a very few—can go back to Edward VII and the Diamond Jubilee of Queen Victoria. On all these Royal occasions the bells have been heard and we trust always will.

Now that the public have again shown interest, we hope that many recruits will be coming along and those ringers who have returned to the ropes after an absence will again find continuing pleasure and help those who are not so experienced.

Our thanks to those contributors who responded so well to our request for reports to be sent in quickly. It will be a problem to get everything we would like in the regular columns of *The Ringing World*, but as always we shall do our best. If one of your young ringers managed a "first", why not get a copy of the issue in which it is recorded, get all the ringers who also took part to autograph it and present it to him/her. In the years ahead that youngster will be as proud of that copy as he or she felt when the conductor said "That's all" and success had been attained.

**MIDNIGHT BELLS**

When the Mayor of Derby (Cllr. Jeffery Tillet) announced at the Civic Reception for the Central Council that H.M. the Queen had graciously granted Derby city status from midnight, June 6-7, the Provost of the Cathedral (V. Rev. R. A. Beddoes) suggested the ringers should ring the bells at midnight. This they did, and Stedman and Grandsire Caters were enjoyed—as also was the sherry supplied by the Provost.

**REPAIRS**

When one of the gudgeons on the fourth at Harrow Weald, Middx., broke away from the headstock during the last weekend in May, it looked, to everyone's great disappointment as if there would be no Jubilee ringing.

The headstock was removed and taken to Loughborough on Wednesday, June 1. Messrs. John Taylor & Co. fitted two new gudgeons in 48 hours and the headstock was replaced on June 3. Peal and quarter-peal attempts were able to take place over the weekend.

**UP IN THE WORLD**

Since February, Melksham Bell-ringers have been very busy constructing a new ringing floor in the tower at St. Michael's Church. The work has taken the ringers up approximately 13 feet and it is a great improvement, both for easier bell-handling and a much lighter ringing chamber.

The screen erected on the new floor was given by Mrs. F. K. West in memory of her husband, the late W. C. West, Captain of Melksham for many years and past secretary and president. Salisbury D.G.

The local ringers have been helped by many in this "Do it yourself" project and express their gratitude to all concerned.

The floor was dedicated during a special service on June 5, and following the service a quarter-peal was rung for the Jubilee.

It was the 46th anniversary of the consecration of the church of SS. James and Basil, Newcastle-upon-Tyne, on June 6, and was commemorated when a peal of Double Norwich C.B. Major was rung there for the Queen's Silver Jubilee celebrations.

No doubt Richard Sumner, the local tower captain at Heston, Middx., whose sudden death we reported recently would have been ringing in the Silver Jubilee peal at St. Leonard's Church on June 4. The ringers remembered Dick when they rang the peal. He was the Queen Mother's personal detective and died whilst in Scotland on duty.

In the peal of P.B. Minor at Finchampstead, Berks., Mrs. Winifred White rang the treble—her first peal for 20 years.

As part of the Derbyshire Association's ringing festival and for the visit of the Central Council a peal of Yorkshire S. Major was rung at the church of St. Wilfrid of York, West Hallam, on June 4.

The treble ringer in the peal of Stedman Caters rung at Soham, Cambs., on June 4 (Sylvia J. Mitchell), whose first peal it was, rang extremely well. These are none too easy bells, and she is to be congratulated on a very good effort. Since coming to Cambridge University from Wellington, Som., her ringing capabilities have considerably improved.

At St. Mary's, Bletchley, Bucks., there was a local peal of P.B. Major—the first there for 38 years by a Sunday service band.

The first peal on ten bells in Africa took place on Saturday, June 4, at the Cathedral of St. Mary and All Saints, Salisbury, Rhodesia. A full report, photograph and details of the band will appear in a later issue.

After the peal at Llangollen on Friday, 10th June, rung in honour of the Queen's Silver Jubilee, it was noted on a plaque on the tower wall that the bells had been cast and installed by Taylor's in honour of Queen Victoria's Golden Jubilee.

The peal rung on June 4th at Easton Neston, Northants, was also a compliment to Lord Hesketh and his bride, Claire Manton.

The peals rung by the Lancashire Association at Oldham and Worsley on Jubilee Day were the two successful peal attempts from three which had been planned. The third attempt at Accrington degenerated from Cambridge S. Maximus to an unsuccessful attempt for eight all the work Spiced Surprise Major—the lack of numbers being

caused by illness, tiredness and an excess of "Jubilee Spirit" the previous evening. Martin Whiteley deserves special mention for cycling 40 miles over the Pennines from Sheffield to take part in the three attempts and then cycling the 40 miles back to Sheffield afterwards.

Bill Myers, the captain of St. Andrew's, Plymouth, circled the tower twice by ringing the 4th to the peal there on Jubilee Day. His brother Tom is the only other ringer to have done this.

The band were delighted in the performance of David Manners at Landulph, Cornwall, for it was his first quarter on the treble and he is from a call-change tower.

The Silver Jubilee peal at St. John-the-Divine, Leicester, also commemorated the 75th anniversary of the dedication of the Victoria Memorial bells (24.6.02).

William A. Stoat (69) was taking part and conducting a Jubilee quarter peal at Stoke St. Michael, Coventry, when he collapsed and was found to be dead on arrival at the local hospital. Bill was a great tower-grabber in his younger days of ringing.

A few days before Jubilee celebrations the clapper of the 7th at Leatherhead parted company with its bell and repairs were not possible before a quarter peal attempt on June 5 and a peal attempt on June 7. However, both were successful using 1 2 3 4 5 6 8 10—which the conductor said is not too bad a combination. "We were not going to let a little thing like a missing clapper upset our Jubilee celebrations," he added.

Incidentally, ringing the fifth in the peal was the conductor's wife, Pauline Smith. Pauline is churchwarden at the parish church and we doubt if there are many—if any—other lady churchwardens who have rung a peal in the local tower whilst in office. It was 180 years ago that the last (male) churchwarden rang a peal at Leatherhead.

The 50th anniversary of the first peal of Royal on the bells of St. Andrew, Plymouth, was noted when the Jubilee peal of Pl. Bob Royal was rung on June 7.

The Jubilee peal at Somersham, Cambs, on June 8th, was also a compliment to the Rector, Rev. A. P. Ludlow, who was ordained on June 8th, 1952.

Four of the peal band at Hornchurch, Essex, had also rung in the Coronation peal, and the same conductor called the same composition, while Andrew Salisbury, one of the four, finally circled the tower.

The local band at Winchester Cathedral who rang a Jubilee peal on June 7th record their association with the composer, Thomas Hooley, who was a regular member of the band while he was at Winchester College. Bad luck dogged peal attempts at Gamston, Notts. Three peal attempts made in eight days were all unsuccessful. Is it a record? asks Mr. H. Denman.

The five bells at Aslacton, Norfolk, have been silent since 1917 when the second was cracked. The framework is in need of attention before any regular ringing can take place on the sound four but, for the occasion of the Jubilee, the architect, in consultation with the Belfry Repairs Advisory Committee, allowed four short touches to be rung with the frame under constant observation. The bells, dating from 1604 to 1614, are the oldest five from the Norwich foundry of William Brend in existence and it is hoped to make repairs to the cracked bell and to the frame: it would be a pity if they were silent for another 60 years.

A quarter peal was started at 10.25 p.m. on June 6 when the Dundry, Som., beacon was blazing.

On June 4 a peal at Dalton-in-Furness, Cumbria, for the Queen's Jubilee was also to mark the institution of vicar (Rev. Trevor Park). Dalton had been without a vicar for eight months since the last vicar died suddenly on September 24.

The peal of Minor at Great Barr, W. Midlands, was quite an achievement for the ringers of St. Margaret's, being the first peal ever rung by a service band, containing five first pealers, and a first as conductor.

At their first attempt a first peal for Anne and John Warboys was at Thorley, Herts., and they both rang very well indeed. The day of the peal was also John's 15th birthday.

Philip Graves rang his 100th peal at Shepshed, Leics., for the Jubilee and he is only 16 (1,000 by 25?).

At Wedmore, Som., veteran ringer Arthur Duckett (82) was up at 4.15 a.m. on Jubilee day to ring at 4.45 a.m., just as he had done for King George V's Jubilee and for the Coronations of King George VI and the present Queen. Queens were rung on the 30 cwt. eight bells, according to a newspaper report. Next year Wedmore celebrates the 1100th anniversary of the Treaty of Wedmore, when King Alfred the Great made peace with the Danes in the village.

Bad luck dogged peal attempts at Gamston, Notts. Three peal attempts made in eight days were all unsuccessful. Is it a record asks Mr. H. Denman.

At Felmersham, Beds., the church was decorated for a Jubilee flower festival and a quarter rung on June 5.

A Jubilee peal of Plain Bob Royal was rung at Salisbury Cathedral, Rhodesia, on Saturday, June 4, conducted by Stephen W. Barton.

The band that rang the peal at East Ilsley, Bucks., for the Queen's Silver Jubilee consisted of seven members of the Sunday service band plus Harry Wells from Harwell, who also often helps out on Sundays. Although three of the band had not rung a peal for nearly 20 years, they did not need much persuading to ring for this very special occasion, and a very well struck peal resulted. An extra pleasure was in store afterwards; when ordering a round of drinks in "The Swan" the landlady informed them that it had been paid for by David Vince from Chaddleworth who also often helps out with Sunday ringing and who had called in especially two days previously to leave a drink behind the bar.

Bells were heard on BBC Nationwide on Jubilee day from three churches in South Norfolk. The light eight at Saxlingham Nethergate were recorded as a peal started at 7.30 a.m. followed by Tasburgh's five where the ninth century round tower was shown; Dickleburgh bells, three of which are pre-Reformation, were heard ringing some slow and dignified call-changes.

A wedding compliment to Jennifer E. Bell and Graham W. Elmes, who were married at Freshford, Avon, was a peal at Abson, Avon, on June 4—which was being rung for the Jubilee.

The peal at Ruddington (Notts.) was specially arranged to enable Walter Nichols (aged 82 years) to come out of semi-retirement and ring a peal for the Silver Jubilee. Both he and Syd Adams rang for the previous Silver Jubilee in 1935. How many other Royal occasions they have rung for they just can't remember. It also enabled Philippa Tomson who is here from Rhodesia to ring a peal for the Silver Jubilee—she also claims a record that very few can claim—she has rung on every bell in her own country—all sixteen of them!—W.E.

Steep (Hampshire) ringers are very grateful to Mr. and Mrs. Andrew Reeves for ringing in Steep's Jubilee peal at short notice, when illness prevented two of the band from ringing. They were luckier at Steep than in their own tower, to which they were going on for a peal in the afternoon. An agitated runner arrived with a telephone message that the Cathedral peal was off, because of Morris Dancing!!! We do not get much opportunity to enjoy a peal at Steep because of the noise factor, but this was for once welcomed. The wind co-operated so effectively that very few people in Steep heard a note of it—the gale carried the particularly beautiful sound of this peal mostly to the next village—two miles away!—C.C.R.

A peal at All Saints, Westgate, Norwich on Jubilee day also welcomed Helen Rachel, daughter of Rachel and Malcolm Brown.

A peal at Benhilton (Sutton), Surrey, was the first peal for three of the band and the first of Grandsire Triples for all. A father and daughter, two married couples and two brothers were the ringers, and for one it was the first peal after 24 years as a ringer.

After ringing at Liss, Hants, for more than 20 years David M. Hughes has circled the tower having rung in each of the last eight peals on the bells, spanning a period of over 14 years. These bells are not readily available for peals; only for some special event: the Jubilee having been extra special! David is the first ever to circle this tower.

Visitors to St. Mary's Church, Bunney, Notts., to see the flower festival decorations, also had the opportunity of hearing the peal there on June 4, being rung for the Silver Jubilee.

As well as for the Jubilee a quarter at Wickham, Hants, celebrated the 50th anniversary of Portsmouth Diocese, and was a Ruby Wedding compliment to Col. and Mrs. L. G. Carpenter-Garnier.

At Guildford (Holy Trinity) a peal of London Surprise Major on June 4 was also for the Patronal Festival. It also marked Canon Michael Hocking's 15 years as Rector of Holy Trinity with St. Mary.

**Central Council at Derby  
Jubilee Day Tour**

There was a full programme for Central Council members, other visitors and Derby D.A. ringers alike on Tuesday, June 7 — Jubilee Day. The usual coach for the tour was only half-full, and several Derby D.A. members joined those Council members who had booked, in order to ensure enough ringers at the towers planned, viz: Darley Dale, Bakewell, Fairfield, Tideswell, and Youlgreave.

The itinerary gave details of the history of each church (which we print below) and the delightful countryside and beautiful scenery greatly enhanced the pleasures of the

tour. A coffee break at Bakewell enabled many to try the "original" Bakewell tart and the cafe also had a television which was very popular, the Queen's arrival at St. Paul's coinciding with the coffee interlude by the tourists. A substantial luncheon was taken at Buxton in the afternoon, and

They also added youth and beauty to the occasion although threatened by the driver that he would put them in the stocks (seen at one village) if they were late getting back to the coach — as happened at one place.



**Darley Dale.** — St. Helen's with its 2,000-year-old yew tree, is built on a site which has evidence of religious observance dating from pre-Christian times. It combines architecture from the Saxon and Norman periods with work from the 13th, 14th, 15th and 19th centuries.

There is a fine ring of eight bells, tenor 15½ cwt.

**Bakewell.** — All Saints' Church is mainly 12th and 13th century with 19th century "improvements". Its unusual octagonal tower contains a 17 cwt. ring of eight bells.

**Fairfield,** on the outskirts of Buxton. St. Peter's has an easy-going ring of eight, tenor 12 cwt.

**Tideswell,** St. John, is popularly known as "The Cathedral of the Peak" — a title earned by virtue of its magnificent 14th century architecture. Again, there are eight bells, tenor 13 cwt.

**Youlgreave,** All Saints', which was reached via Chatsworth Park. The exterior of the church is mainly perpendicular, and the massive tower, which dominates the village, contains an excellent heavy ring of eight bells — tenor 26½ cwt.

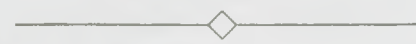


The eight bells of All Saints, Youlgreave with a 26½ cwt tenor beat down their music on the houses and other buildings in and around the village. A hotel and tea rooms under the tower certainly gets the benefit (?) of the bells — somewhat in excess we feel. The proprietor of the tea rooms who has a young family said she thought the bells were too noisy outside, and she was at one time one of the local band. When she kindly opened her establishment for the visiting ringers on Jubilee Day we persuaded her to join others in this photograph (l. to r.) Mrs Olive Barnett, W. C. a little tea-room at Youlgreave opened especially for the ringers. (The lady proprietor was, before her marriage, a local ringer!)

Church of St. Cuthbert's, Prospect, was left money to purchase bells, the division of ringers into separate tower groups, already in decay, has come to an end and as, with a few exceptions, all the ringers in South Australia are members of the St. Peter's Society, we tend to regard ourselves as Adelaide ringers and, as a group, service the three ringable towers—St. Peter's, Adelaide; St. Cuthbert's, Prospect; and St. Andrew's, Walkerville.

Unfortunately none of the ringing towers has a pleasant nearby "local" inn, so the cohesiveness of the band has been promoted, and is assured, by convivial gatherings at ringers' houses after Tuesday evening practices and by "breakfasts" in between Sunday morning ringing in the suburbs and at the Cathedral.

**HEAVIEST RING**

The ring at St. Peter's is the heaviest in the Southern Hemisphere, which creates certain problems. New recruits are taught bell-control on the lighter and more manageable bells of St. Andrew's, Walkerville, and there is a children's class at St. Cuthbert's, Prospect, the lightest ring in Adelaide. However, it is not only learners who take advantage of the suburban towers and on the second Tuesday of each month the Cathedral holds a "Surprise" Practice on the light eight at Prospect.

Although quarter peals are often rung, there is a distinct lack of interest in peal ringing, due not only to the heaviness of the bells but to a lack of suitable conductors and ringers interested in collecting peals. Attempts are made as far as is possible whenever there are ringers from interstate and overseas and we are fortunate in seeing quite a large number of such visitors. They are most welcome as the Society does not count many ringers and despite much publicity in the press and on TV and massive teaching programmes we fail to get, or hold, many recruits. Most of the ringers, too, do not live near the Cathedral and have other commitments: to families and to Parish Churches, and these sometimes conflict with ringing requirements.

**PRESENTED TO HM THE QUEEN**

We do manage to ring for all the Sunday and special services listed in the Cathedral Notes and and for all weddings for which bells are requested. This seems to please the Cathedral authorities who now ask us to ring after important services as well as before them and who arranged for the **captain to be presented to the Queen and Prince Philip when they attended morning prayer on March 20th, 1977, while visiting Adelaide.**

Service ringing at St. Peter's is always preceded by the ringers' prayer which reflects the close association of the Society and the life of the Church. For years payment for weddings was put aside to buy and donate a Bellringers' pew, which is now duly roped off with "sallies".

Our bells are often heard internationally, particularly when we ring for weddings while a test match is being played on the Adelaide Oval, thus broadcasting to the world the sound of the noblest ring of bells in the Southern Hemisphere.

**THIRTIETH ANNIVERSARY  
OF DEDICATION**

On the occasion of the Patronal Festival on July 3rd the thirtieth anniversary of the dedication of the bells was celebrated. Ringers who had been members of the Society in the past were invited to take part in a specially commissioned Evensong as well as attending the main 11 a.m. service and parish luncheon afterwards.

**ST. PETER'S CATHEDRAL  
ADELAIDE, S.A.**

By DOUGLAS BELL in consultation with  
W. B. PITCHER and R. G. STEVENSON

THE FOUNDATION STONE of St. Peter's Cathedral, Adelaide, was laid on St. Peter's Day, June 29th, 1869, but regular services were held here only from 1876 onwards. The architecture is of the Gothic Revival period based on the plans of William Butterfield. Like many such buildings of the 19th century it took some time to complete, and the towers and spires were not dedicated until 1902, and it was not until the patronal festival of 1947 that the bells, hung in the left hand tower, were dedicated by the late Rt. Rev. B. P. Robin, then Bishop of Adelaide.

**THE BELLS—1947-1977**

There is a ring of eight bells in C. of which the 1¼ cwt. tenor, Great Frederick, bears the inscription:

ME FRATRESQVE MEOS AD LAVDEM  
PATRIS ET FILII ET SPIRITVS  
SANCTVS DONVM DEDIT  
FREDERICKVS ALLEN LAKEMAN +  
AD MCMXLI

(Frederick Allen Lakeman gave me and my brothers to the praise of the Father and the Son and the Holy Ghost. 1941)

Mr. Lakeman was a warden at the Cathedral for many years, and on his death in 1941 his Will revealed a bequest of £10,000 to provide St. Peter's with bells. The war interfered with placing

the order and it is not quite clear how such a heavy eight came to be ordered, but in 1946 John Taylor & Co. cast the 7½ ton octave at Loughborough.

They are hung in two tiers in a very solid tower in a typical 5-3 split.

**THE BELLRINGERS**

(see photograph on previous page)

Many ringers have come and gone since the St. Peter's Cathedral Bellringers' Society was formed on December 22nd, 1946, under the leadership of seven captains appointed by the previous Bishops and now Archbishop of Adelaide.

The tower captains have been: P. R. Vincent 1949-1951; I. J. Webber 1951-1954; H. F. Cox 1954-1958; C. H. Bagot 1958-1960; W. B. Pitcher 1960-1970; D. J. Bleby 1970-1976; D. A. Bell 1976-.

The last two captains still ring and the present captain is particularly indebted to them for their continued loyalty to, and service in, the tower: Bill Pitcher particularly as unofficial ringing master, and David Bleby for maintenance of the bells.

With the appointment of the present captain, who started ringing when his previous Parish
